A: Nurse! 3 cc's of twine and my best needle, stat!

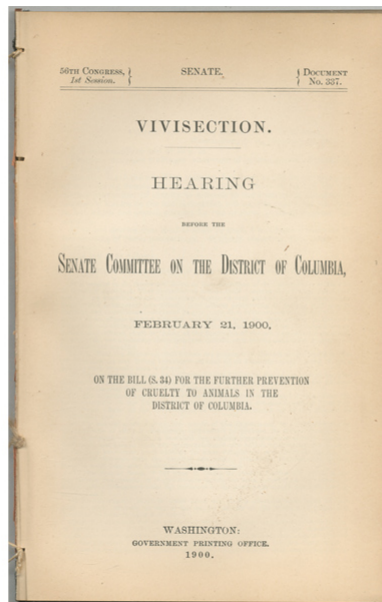
T: I'm not a nurse. Must everything be so dramatic?

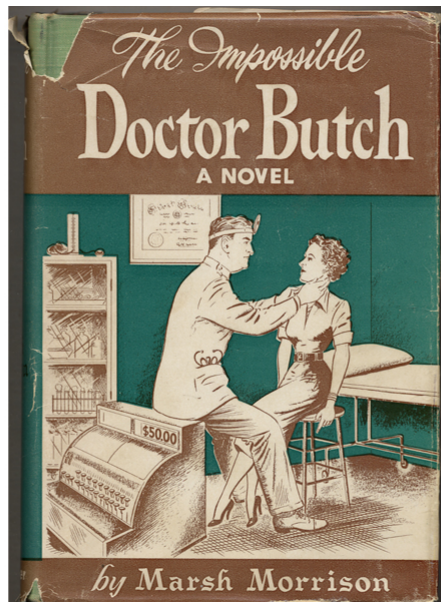

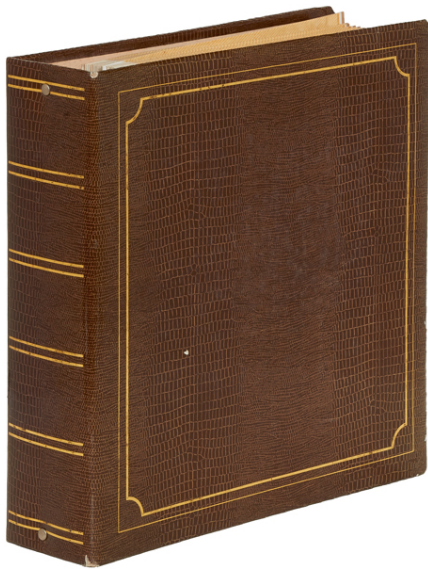

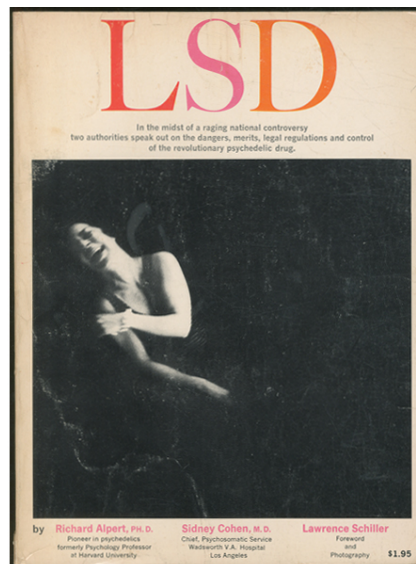

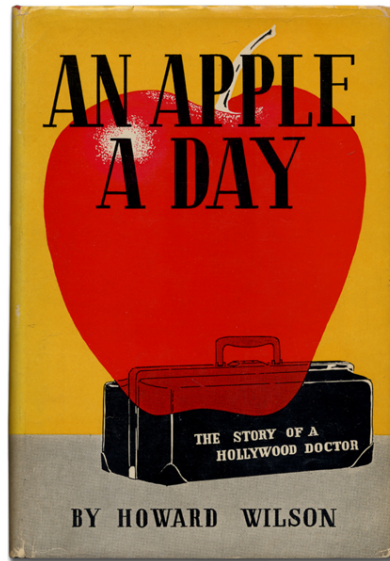

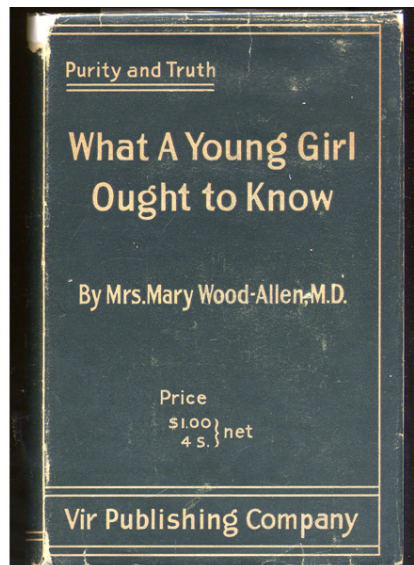
