




7. Gladys NELSON [Disbound Photo Album]: World War I Nurse England, France: circa 1915





First edition. Robertson was a Scottish-born pioneer of modern obstetrics.






18. Twentieth Annual Announcement of the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania 1869-70




19. The Wonderful Kola Plant, from the Heart of Africa. Himalya, (The Kola Compound.) Nature's Great Cure for Asthma
