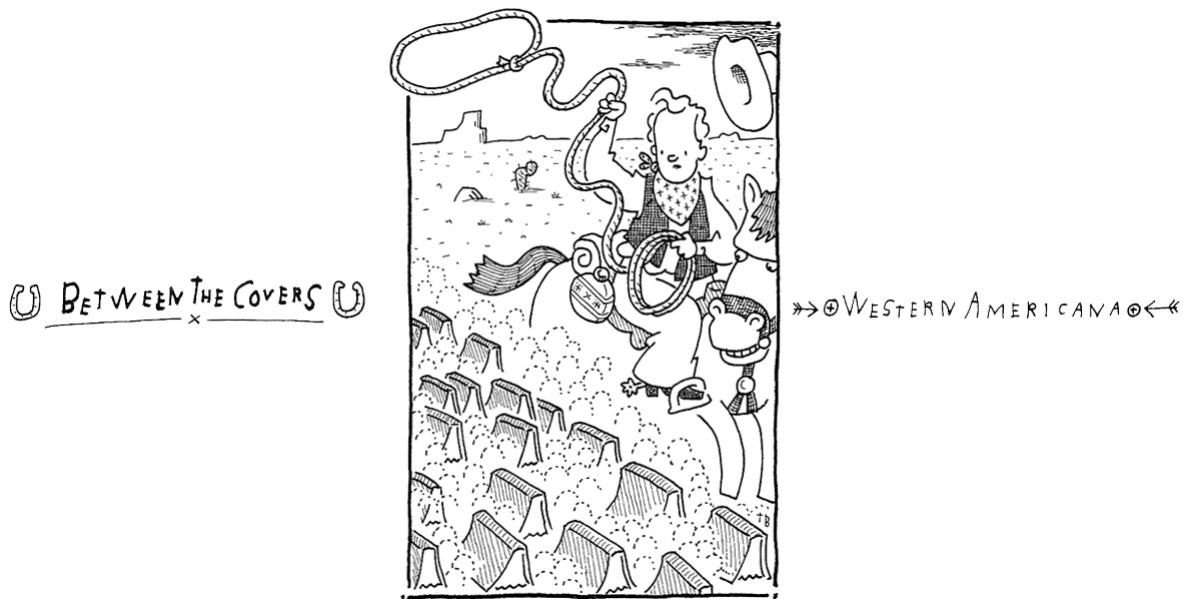

A: "Back where a friend is a friend..."

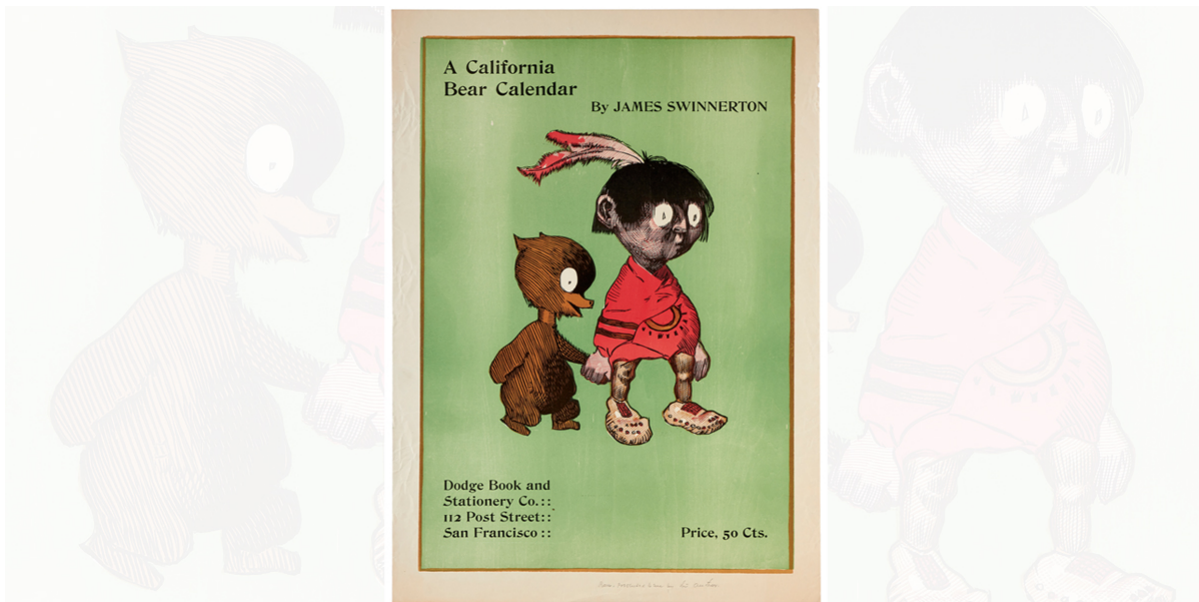
T: Can you make an elist without a song and dance?

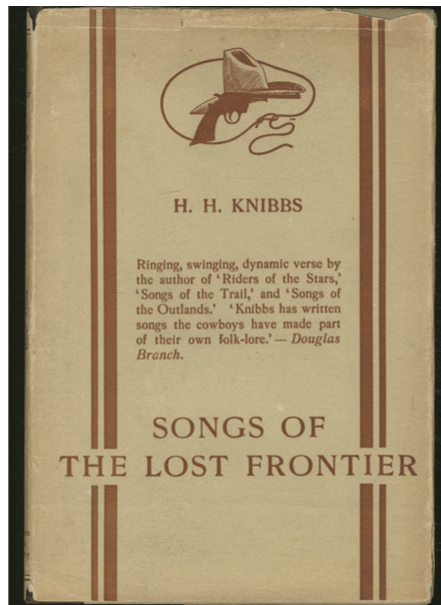

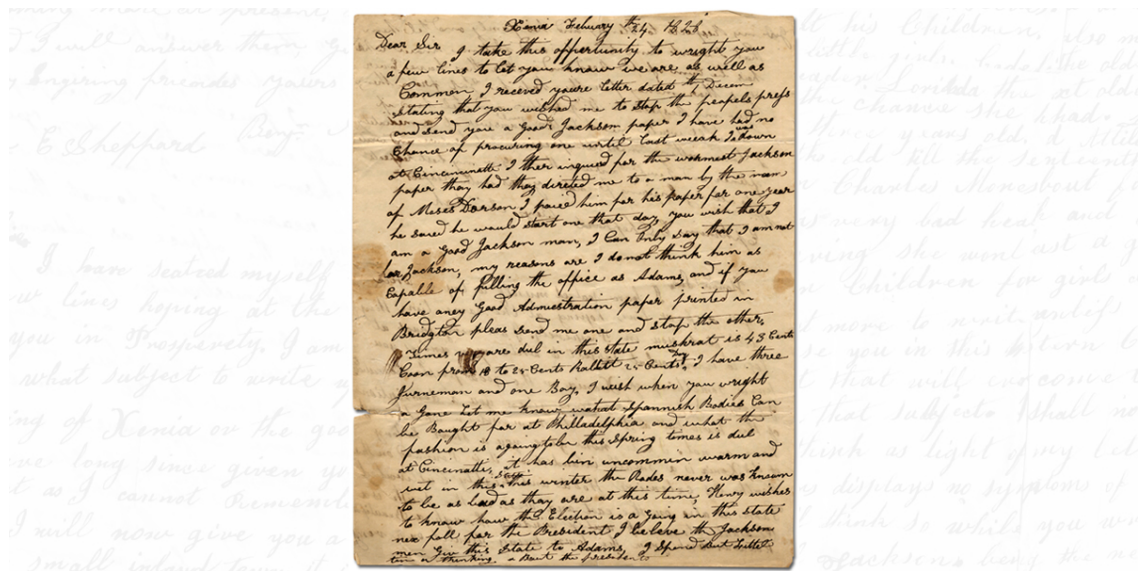

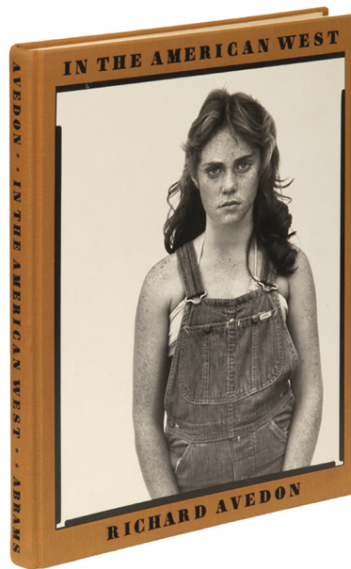

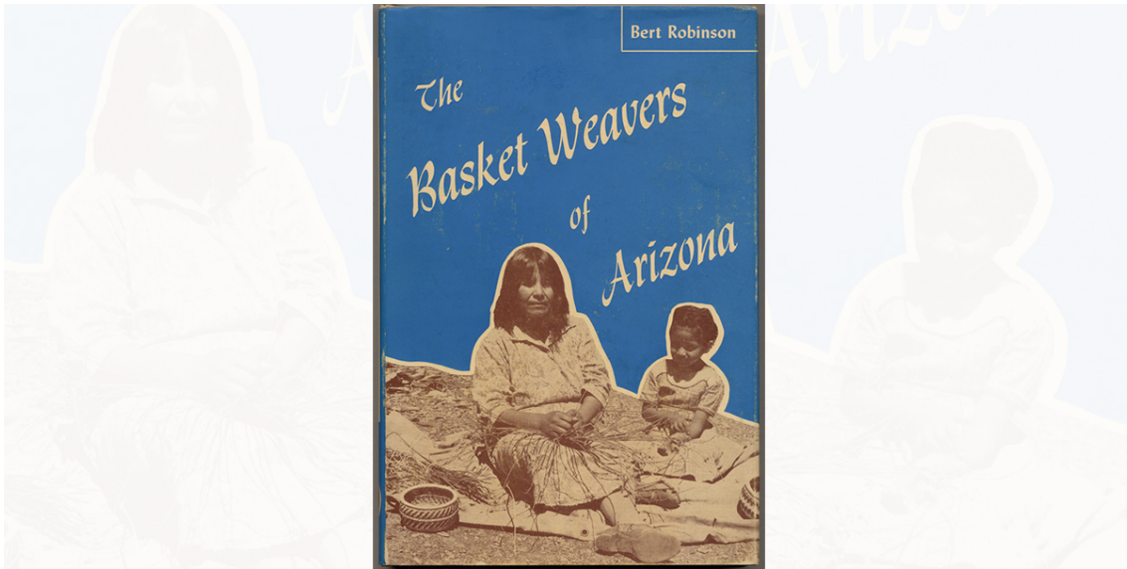
